

PEACE ARCH CURLING CLUB
A Society duly incorporated on the 25th day of July, A.D., 1966,
under the “Societies Act” of the Province of British Columbia

CONSTITUTION

1. The name of the Society is Peace Arch Curling Club.
2. The objectives of the Society are:
 - a) To promote the game of curling in the Cities of White Rock and Surrey in affiliation with other curling associations.
 - b) To bring together all sports minded men and women who have an interest in the promotion of curling.
 - c) To cooperate with other clubs and associations having like objectives.
 - d) To promote and encourage the education in good sportsmanship and curling of the junior citizens of the district.
 - e) To purchase, hire, or otherwise acquire for the purpose of the Society any real or personal property and, in particular, any lands, buildings, furniture, club and household effects, and any and all apparatus, appliances, conveniences and accommodations for the purpose aforesaid and, so far as may be legal, from time to time to sell, demise, let, mortgage or dispose of the same.
 - f) To erect, maintain, improve or alter any buildings or other equipment for the purpose of the Society.
 - g) To borrow or raise money by any lawful means whatsoever or by the issue of or upon security of bonds, debentures, bills of exchange, promissory notes, or other obligations or securities of the club, or by mortgage or charge of all or any part of the property of the Society in accordance with the provisions of the By-laws and the authority of an extraordinary resolution of the Society.
3. The operations of the Society are to be carried on chiefly in the Cities of White Rock and Surrey in the Province of British Columbia, in accordance with the attached By-Laws. This clause shall be unalterable.
4. The Peace Arch Curling Club Society guarantees access to any recreation facility which is constructed in part or in whole with funds received from Her Majesty in the Right of the Province of British Columbia, to any person or persons who wish to use it in accordance with the purpose of the facility; the charge for using the said facility to those members of the public who are not members of the Society shall be either a daily or hourly charge, or other such charges, as agreed upon between the Society and the Ministry of the Provincial Secretary and Government Services, or the Ministry of Government charged with this responsibility. This clause shall be unalterable.
5. In the event of the dissolution of the Peace Arch Curling Club Society where the Peace Arch Curling Club Society has received funds from Her Majesty in the Right of the Province of British Columbia to construct, in part or whole, any recreation facility, the Ministry of the Provincial Secretary and Government Services shall be advised prior to such action and any assets remaining after payment of all debts and obligations shall be distributed to a registered charitable organization with similar purposes in British Columbia as recognized by Revenue Canada, or to a suitable level of local government. This clause shall be unalterable.
